

## English: We are Authors

**Writing:** As authors this half term, the children will first be studying the CBeebies narrative animation of **Jo Jo and Gran Gran - It's time to go on a voyage**. We will be talking about Gran Gran's journey from St Lucia to the UK and join them as they donate Gran Gran's objects from the journey to an exhibition. We will be thinking about our own special objects and recreate the story. Our second unit will be focused on writing our own **travel diary** whilst on Safari. We will be inspired by studying a travel journal from a journey across the Antarctic.

**Reading:** Our reading sessions will focus on developing children's vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation and retrieval skills through discussion-based learning. We will explore a range of poetry, fiction and non-fiction texts throughout the half term, based on our enquiry or seasonal events. For example, '**Jack Frost**', '**Bohdii sees the world**', '**Children just like me**' and '**Noah and the little elephant**'.

Our class text is '**Charlie and The Chocolate factory**' by Roald Dahl.

## RE: We are Philosophers

**JUDAISM: What is the Torah & why is it so important to Jewish families?** The children will be introduced to Judaism and learn all about The Torah. What makes it so special? What's inside? Where does it live? What makes it so important to the Jewish people?

## PE: We are Athletes

**Outdoor PE/Games on a Wednesday:** Ball skills - throwing, kicking, hitting and striking a variety of balls.

**Indoor PE on a Friday:** Dancing around the world - from the Chinese Dragon Dance to a Mexican Fiesta and the African Desert dance.

Children should come to school wearing their smart PE kit on Wednesdays and Fridays.

**What have you been today?**

**How have you been a mathematician or an author today?**

**What have you enjoyed being today and why?**



## How are schools the same?

### Year 1, Spring 1

#### Enquiry: How are schools the same?

As Geographers, we will be learning about our local area and comparing it's features to Mantin in Malaysia. We will be using the language of physical and human geography to look at similarities and differences. We will also be learning about the continents and oceans.

As Artists, we will be learning about primary and secondary colours and how to mix these using paint.

Our challenge will be to create a poster to show how the schools we have looked at are the same.

## Homework

Children should **read** their schoolbooks to you at least **four times** a week, enjoy a **range of other books** and practice their **phonics**.

We will now be sending home **spelling homework** every Thursday and a **weekly task** for them to complete, such as learning some poetry or extra maths. This will need to be completed by Tuesday.

## Maths: We are Mathematicians

This half term begins with a focus on place value and counting within 20. We will be furthering our understanding of the numbers 10-20, using a number line and comparing and ordering numbers to help us solve maths problems. We will then look at addition and subtraction within 20. We will use our knowledge of number bonds and doubles to help solve finding the difference, missing number and word problems.

**How can you help at home?** Please help your child apply their maths in practical situations. Practise counting to 20 and back to 0. Ask for your child's help when adding or subtracting numbers within 20, in the shop, or in the kitchen etc.

## Wellbeing: We are Philosophers

We will be reading the story of "**Angry Arthur**" by Hiawyn Oram. As we are reading, we will be discussing our emotions, what appropriate and proportionate behaviour means and how it is important to ask for help when needed. We will look at how Arthur likes to relax his brain and take some responsibility for looking after the school environment.

## Music: We are Musicians

As musicians, we are going to be learning about Malaysian instrument families and The Malaysian Orchestra. We will be listening to both traditional and modern Malaysian music including the pianist and composer Adeline Wong.
