

English: We are Authors

Writing: As authors this half term we will start by understanding different types of poetry then learning and reciting a poem. We will then be understanding how to write a persuasive leaflet and writing our own. It would be great if you could get some leaflets over the holidays to bring in.

Reading: For our class text we are continuing with 'Charlie and the chocolate factory' by Roald Dahl.

Reading- Reading sessions will focus on developing children's vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation and retrieval skills through discussion-based learning. We will explore a range of poetry, fiction and non-fiction texts throughout the half term, based on our enquiry or seasonal events. For example, '2030: A day in the life of tomorrow's kids', 'Martha maps it out' by Leigh Hodgkinson, 'Planes and Rockets and Things that fly' by Richard Scarry, 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' by Quentin Blake.

Spellings: The children will be given 8 words to learn each week. These are from the 200 high frequency year 1 word list. The tests are not formal, but we write the words out and check their spelling every Monday. The children benefit hugely from being familiar with them.

How can you help at home? Listen to your child read at least 4 times a week; share a book or a text with your child and practice their weekly spellings.

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Music: We are Musicians

As musicians, we will learn about making sounds with our voices and with objects. We will create background sounds to accompany our enquiry presentations.

Enquiry:

How will we get around in the future?

As Geographers, we will be learning the continents and oceans. We will look at the four points of the compass and what countries are to the North, South, East and West of the UK. We will think about what human and physical features we would see if we travelled over an ocean to another country.

As Historians, we will find out about how people travelled around in the past and create a simple timeline of vehicles.

As Engineers, we will design and create prototypes of air or water vehicles that might be used in the future.

Our challenge will be to plot an overseas journey on a map and present our vehicle and journey in a film.

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Maths: We are Mathematicians

This half term we will be focused on basic multiplication and division, starting with counting in 2's 10's and 5's. We will then be seeing if we can recognise, add and make different groups and share groups. We will be making arrays and doubles to help us.

After that, we will be starting to look at the concept of fractions by seeing if we can recognise and find halves and quarters, firstly is shapes and then as quantities.

How can you help at home? Help your child to count and march in 2's 10's and 5's. See if they can make groups of 2's 10's and 5's out of anything. Start introducing them to the vocabulary of half and quarter.
