

English: We are Authors

Writing: As authors this half term we will have a focus on writing a non-chronological report about a country, particularly looking at Singapore.

We will look at the features included in a non-chronological report and then create our own about a country linked to the enquiry.

Reading: For our class text we are continuing with 'Fantastic Mr Fox' by Roald Dahl.

Reading- Reading sessions will focus on developing children's vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation and retrieval skills through discussion-based learning. We will explore a range of poetry, fiction and non-fiction texts throughout the half term, based on our enquiry or seasonal events. For example '2030: A day in the life of tomorrow's kids', 'Planes and Rockets and Things that fly' by Richard Scarry, 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' by Quentin Blake.

Spellings: The children will continue to be given 8 words to learn each week. These may be words related to our enquiry or words we are finding difficult on a regular basis (as a class). There will be no formal spelling test but we will look at these words each Friday. The children benefit hugely from being familiar with them.

How can you help at home? Listen to your child read at least 4 times a week; share a book or a text with your child and practice their weekly spellings.

Music: We are Musicians

As musicians, we will learn about making sounds with our voices and with objects. We will create background sounds to accompany our enquiry presentations.

PE: We are Athletes

Outdoor PE/Games: Tennis

Indoor PE: Dance

Children should come to school wearing their smart PE kit on their PE day.



How will we get around in the future? **Year 2, Summer 1**

Enquiry:

How will we get around in the future?

As Geographers, we will be learning the continents and oceans. We will look at the four points of the compass and what countries are to the North, South, East and West of the UK. We will think about what human and physical features we would see if we travelled over an ocean to another country.

As Historians, we will find out about how people travelled around in the past and create a simple timeline of vehicles.

As Engineers, we will design and create prototypes of air or water vehicles that might be used in the future.

Our challenge will be to plot an overseas journey on a map and present our vehicle and journey in a film.

Maths: We are Mathematicians

This half term we will begin to look at money, thinking about pounds and pence and then counting with money. We will be able to make and compare different amounts.

We will then look at multiplication and division, counting and adding equal groups, putting things into groups and sharing things out. We will also look at doubling and halving, odd and even numbers.

How can you help at home? Help your child to identify coins and talk about what each coin is worth. Set up your own shop or café with things to pay for. Let your child help with counting out the coins to pay at the shops.

Wellbeing: We are Philosophers

We will be looking at the story "The girl who never made mistakes" by Mark Pett and Gary Rubinstein to understand how we can learn from our mistakes and how being kind to ourselves can make us happy. We will also learn about perseverance.

RE: We are Philosophers

Who is Allah and why do Muslims worship him?

In this unit, children will learn that Muslims believe in one God, Allah. They will learn that Allah has 99 beautiful names that express what Allah is like. They will explore how prayer is a part of worship of Allah.
